How to text in color discord

For example, this text is highlighted in yellow and probably caught your eye first. There are several methods for highlighting text. To proceed, select a method from the list below and follow the instructions. If you are working on an HTML5 page, the tag can quickly highlight text. Below is an example of the how to use the mark tag and its result. If your browser supports the tag, "highlighted text" should have a yellow background. Highlight text with only HTML code To highlight text with HTML code and support for all browsers, set the background-color style, as shown in the example below, using the HTML tag. Tip In the example above, the HTML tag has a background-color code of #FFFF00, which is yellow. In this case, the word "yellow" could be used in place of the color code, or any other color name for that matter. Tip With the same code, you could also highlight one or more words within a paragraph to draw attention to a specific section of the text. Highlight text with CSS & HTML You can also create a CSS class and set the "background-color" attribute, as shown in the example below. Example code body { background-color:blue; } highlightme { background-color:#FFFF00; } p { background-color:#FFFFFF; } In the CSS code above, there are three elements being defined. First, the body background color is set to blue, second, a new class called "highlightme" with a yellow background, and finally, the paragraph tag has a white background. If you want to use the "highlightme" class to highlight your text, you can create a tag in your HTML which references the CSS class. Additional information Those who already use Discord know what a useful and fun communication app it can be. Originally designed with gamers in mind, Discord now encourages communities and group chats to form around pretty much every type of fandom or subject — specializing in everything from humorous rants to training guides. This kind of broad usability is great, but it also means that you can run into some communication issues sometimes — maybe a language barrier or an accessibility issue related to a disability. Or maybe, when things get boring, you just want to have a bit of fun with audio cues. And while Discord does have text and voice channels, not everyone knows you can give a text channel voice capabilities whenever you wish via the text-to-speech (TTS) feature. Here's how to enable it and make sure it's working! Step 1: Head to Discord's settings Open up your Discord app. This guide focuses on the client for Mac or PC, but if you're using an extension or web login instead, you should still be able to find all the same features, although things may look a little different. Look at the bottom of your Discord window and you will see a gear icon next to the headset icon — this is your Settings tool. Select it to open up a side window on the left with all your Discord settings (and if you've never explored these settings before, we encourage you to take a closer look when you're done here, as many are useful). Step 2: Find the text-to-speech feature The Settings menu is divided into several sections. Start by looking for the section that says App Settings. Under it, look for the option that says Text & Images and select it. This is a great section for controlling how your Discord chats look on a particular channel. You can enable or disable emoji reactions and animated emoji, for example. But for now, we're only interested in one feature: Scroll down until you find the section that says Text-To-Speech. Step 3: Enable the TTS function In the Text-To-Speech section, you will see a feature that says Allow playback and usage of /tts command. Make sure that this toggle is enabled. You can now use text-to-speech whenever you want! Fortunately, the TTS process on Discord is very easy. Just go to your channel and type "/tts" and then type your message. Hit enter and your message will appear in the channel without the ts tag. However, this command will also make a voice bot read your message aloud at the same time it is sent. Step 4: Enable channel notifications as necessary There's still one more important thing to do. Look back at the Settings section that says App Settings. You should now find the option that says Notifications. Select it, and it will show you all the various alerts and notifications that Discord has sent you. These don't have much to do with text-to-speech, but go down until you reach the section that says Text-To-Speech Notifications. We will outline the three different choices you can make below. For all channels: This makes all messages read out from text to voice across all Discord channels you are a part of. People don't need to use the "/tts" command, either — any text message sent will be read out by the voice bot. This setting is primarily for accessibility, and while it may be very useful for those who can't see, it's a little too much for the average user. For current selected channel: The channel that you are currently on will read all messages out in text-to-speech. This can be handy for accessibility, but you may also be interested in it if you are busy doing other things on your computer but still want to follow a channel conversation — this way, all new messages will be read out by the automated voice while you can focus on other things. Never: By selecting Never, the system will never read your text aloud. Even if someone uses the "/tts"-specific command, it will remain silent. This tool is a good way to promote privacy and stop spammers. Don't feel obligated to select any of these alternatives we've just outlined. You don't have to employ the TTS function on Discord at all if you don't want to. However, it is an essential step for a couple of other reasons. First off, it might be helpful to have the ability to listen not only to the messages you put in but also to the message stream in its entirety. Second, it's good to remember that other people can always switch off all TTS capabilities for Discord. Many users will do this in case a user starts spamming TTS lines to be frustrating. So, if others have switched to the Never preference, they won't be able to hear your messages out loud. Note about TTS voices Discord doesn't have a unique voice bot for the web app, so it will use the built-in text-to-speech bot supported by your browser. So, if you're Discord via a web page, the TTS voice can change depending on whether you're using Chrome, Firefox, Safari, and so on. You can personalize your voice depending on the features each browser offers. For example, Chrome allows you to change its voice bot and even buy new, unique voices via some extensions. Editors' Recommendations Discord is a popular, free voice and text chat app for gamers. To make the most of this communication app for gamers, add your friends to it. There are several ways to add people on Discord, including from their profile and by using search. These instructions show how to add friends on Discord using the desktop web browser version of the Discord server dashboard. While the Discord app is available for iOS, Android, Windows, Mac, and Linux devices, instructions for the web browser version should be enough to cover how to add friends on Discord, regardless of your operating system. The fastest way to add people on Discord is to search for your friends using their Discord user tag. Log in to your Discord account from the Discord app web browser login screen. From the Home screen on your Discord account's dashboard page, select Friends, located on the left side of the screen. The Friends menu opens on the right side of the screen. At the top of the menu, select Add Friends. This opens a window containing a large search box in which you can search for your friends by their username, also known as a DiscordTag. In the large search box, enter the DiscordTag of the person you want to add. When you finish typing, select Send Friend Request, located at the end of the search box. The DiscordTag consists of a case-sensitive username, a pound sign (#), and your friend's 4-digit DiscordTag number. If you didn't find your friends using search, add people using their Discord profile, but some caveats apply. This method doesn't allow you to add a friend from their profile if they aren't part of your Discord server or you aren't joined to their server. You must have at least one server in common, preferably your server. Log in to your Discord app account from the web browser login web page. From your account's dashboard screen, on the left side of the screen, select your profile icon, which is located beneath the Home screen icon (the Discord logo). Selecting your profile icon opens your server's dashboard. On the right side of this screen is your chat list. The person you want to add as a friend on Discord should be listed on this chat list. Right-click the person's name, then select Profile. A small, black dialog box appears, showing your friend's profile summary. Select Send Friend Request. You can also add someone on Discord if you've been in a chat with them before. It's a fast way to get connected to people you already talk to. Log in to your Discord account via the web browser login web page. Select your profile icon, located on the left side of the screen, under the Home icon. Go to your chat list, located on the right side of the screen. Right-click the person in your chat list you want to add. From the menu that appears, select Add Friend. Thanks for letting us know! Tell us why! To enable text-to-speech go to User Settings > Notifications. Use the Discord chat command /tts, followed by your message. Be sure to leave a space between the command and the text. Other users need to have this feature enabled to hear the audio. This article explains how to enable text to speech in Discord and how to get your messages read out loud by a bot using the desktop app on a Mac or PC. Text to speech is not available in the mobile app. There are two settings you need to turn on for the text to speech feature to work. You can enable the function across all of your channels or only the current one. Open the Discord app on your Mac or PC. Click the User Settings gear on the bottom left of the screen. Click Notifications on the left rail. Scroll down to Text-to-Speech Notifications. Select For all channels or For current selected channel to determine who will have a chance to hear your message. (To turn the feature off, select Never.) This setting works both ways: you'll be able to send audio texts, and you'll hear audio messages from others in the current channel or all channels, depending on the option you chose. Back on the left rail, click Text & Images. Toggle on the switch next to Allow playback & usage of /tts command. Click the X on the top right to leave Settings. Once you've enabled the feature, you can use it right away by typing a command, which is: /tts Be sure to include a space between the command and your text. If other members of the channel have the feature disabled, they won't hear the audio. However, they can still see the text. Ask others to turn the feature on if you want to communicate this way. Open Discord and navigate to the channel in which you'd like to send a voice message. To have your message read aloud, type: /tts your message Press Enter to send the message. The message will appear without the slash command. A voice bot will read aloud your message, preceded by "Username said." For example, "Molly said hello." Use the /tts slash command anytime you want to share an audio message. Thanks for letting us know! Tell us why! While one of the most lopsided Discord debates may be choosing between its Dark and Light themes, color-based customization doesn't reach far outside of this choice and setting custom role colors. However, Discord supports markdown. If you're unfamiliar with markdown, it's the simple symbol-based formatting you apply to messages to add effects like bolding and italicization. Of all markdown supported by Discord, code blocks may be the most versatile. You don't have to be a coder to use code blocks, and many users aren't aware that these blocky boxes actually allow users to add color to their text. Confused? In this article, let's talk about code blocks and how you can use them to create Discord color messages. What Are Code Blocks On Discord? Code blocks, sometimes referred to as code boxes or simply boxes, are a form of markdown supported by Discord's rendering engine. If you're not sure what markdown is, some of the most commonly-used tricks are to surround your text in single asterisks ("like this") to italicize text or double asterisks ("like this") to bold text. Discord supports markdown for these, along with underlines (like this), strikethroughs (—like this—), spoiler tags (||like this||), quotes (> like this), and single-line code blocks (like this). However, along with single-line code blocks, Discord also supports multi-line code blocks. A single-line code block adds a dark background to white, monospaced text, making it easy for Discord users to share brief snippets of code in a readable format. Multi-line code blocks allow users to share more complex code that spans across several lines. To create a multi-line code block, surround your text in triple backticks ("like this"). It will create a large, dark box around your text, format it in a monospaced font, and preserve all indentations. One thing that really sets multi-line code blocks apart from other markdown is that they support syntax highlighting. What Is Syntax Highlighting In Code Blocks On Discord? Syntax highlighting is a feature commonly found in text editors and Notepad alternatives like Notepad++ and Sublime Text. It allows coders to define the programming language of a document so that important elements of the code will be colorized, for easier reading and understanding. As Discord's multi-line code block markup is intended to be used for this purpose, there are clever ways that you can take advantage of it to add color to your messages. To add syntax highlighting to your multi-line code blocks, you have to enter a keyword after the first set of triple backticks. Here's an example: "md is the keyword to format your code blocks with basic markdown. < Other syntax highlighting includes JSON and Python. >" When written as a message on Discord, that will appear like this: Knowing which formatting styles bring out which colors is a shot in the dark unless you've got a guide covering them all, which we do. Discord Code Block Syntax Highlighting Styles Below is a list of all of the known syntax highlighting keywords that Discord's multi-line code block markup supports. asciidoc autohotkey bash coffeescript cpp cs css diff fix gisl ini json md ml prolog py xl xml As time passes, Discord may continue to add new syntax highlighting options. While using Discord's syntax highlighting may not be as clean an implementation as having the option to just change your text color, it's still very useful and the best solution available right now to create Discord color messages. There are plenty of options, so if you ever have a large chunk of text that you need to be formatted for easier reading—such as a command list for your Discord music bot - be sure to try code blocks out.
