Ava is someone who saves the world every day without waiting for any prophecy to tell her what to do. I hope some of my dragons grow up to be just like her! And I knew the minute I met our showrunners, Dan Milano and Christa Starr, that they are funny, kind, super-nerd kindred spirits who 100% understand what I’m trying to do with the books. FanWings, you will love them, too! In their talented hands, I have faith the TV show will fulfill the dreams of all the people who’ve asked me that question over the years.When I started writing this series, I wanted to show that any dragon can be part of saving the world, no matter how shy or weird or prickly or overly enthusiastic they are. I wanted the readers to feel that, too—that each of you is important and wonderful just as you are, and you can make a difference.I wanted you to see yourselves in the pages of this dragon world - and now I hope you’ll be able to see yourselves on screen as well.I cannot wait to go on this journey with this team and with you! Shutterstock Ava DuVernay has crossed many genres in her career, but now the Oscar nominee looks set to become the Queen of Dragons – at least in an animated sense. The Queen Sugar creator is teaming with Warner Bros Animation to develop Tui T. Sutherland’s best-selling dragon filled Wings of Fire books into a high end small screen series for the whole family. In the first animated effort for the A Wrinkle in Time director, the exclusive rights to Sutherland’s sweeping fantasy and multi-dragon POV publications of 15 novels, a trio of graphic novels and four short stories were sealed by WBA after a pitched bidding process that went into the eight-figures, I hear. Bringing Wings of Fire to animated life is just the latest offering on DuVernay’s filled dance card. Having just debuted Cherish the Day on OWN last month and currently filming the Rosario Dawson-starring DMZ pilot for HBO Max, the When They See Us helmer is also working on a feature-length documentary on L.A.’s own, the deceased Nipsey Hussle for Netflix. The CAA-repped DuVernay also has a one-hour drama on the Texas oil industry for TNT alongside ex-Queen Sugar showrunner Kat Candler. In a similar genre to DMZ, the ARRAY boss is on the path to a big-budget and big-screen version of Jack Kirby’s New Gods. Part of Warner Bros slate, New Gods is being penned by DuVernay and Tom King. Sutherland is repped by WME. Steven Malk at Writer’s House, and Aron Baumel at Goodman, Genow, Schenkman, Smelkinson & Christopher, who negotiated the rights deal. The film starred Suzanne Pleshette, James Farentino, Lloyd Nolan, Juliet Mills, Jeremy Slate and Ralph Bellamy. The plot concerns a female pilot wanting to become an air racer. Plot Doug Sanborn (Ralph Bellamy) runs a small charter company based at a regional airport. His daughter, Kitty (Suzanne Pleshette), a young female pilot wants to be in the Unlimited class at the air races but her male friends stymie her ambitions. Her former boyfriend Taff Malloy (James Farentino) has recently come back from the US Navy and a stint as a pilot in Vietnam. Now married to Lisa (Juliet Mills), a tragic accident on their honeymoon, results in his wife's death. With Lisa's recent death, Kitty tries to console Taff but he is distraught and rebuffs her. In frustration, she seeks out Taff's rival, bad-boy pilot Hal Random (Jeremy Slate) and runs off with him. When her father and other male friends find out about the affair, they berate Kitty and make her feel so bad she wants to kill herself. Flying her North American P-51 Mustang racing aircraft with the intention of crashing it, Kitty is followed by Taff in his Grumman F8F Bearcat, who tries to talk her out of it. His soothing words finally make an impression and help to bring Kitty back safely.
