The Pandora A service gives you unlimited listening, no announcements and less interruptions, as well as superior audio for \$36/year. Evernote can upgrade \$5/month (\$45/year) to Premium for you if you upload a lot of large files, want to sync files other than images/audio/ink/PDF, or need more collaboration capabilities. Google Storage: If you need more space for your Gmail, Google Docs, and/or Picasa Web Album, further Google Storage is rather cheap. While this victory has been significant, it also serves as a testimony of ongoing issues involving the U.S. educational system. If the wave of protesters is not enough to convince you of the problems surrounding teachers' pay (and other concerns raised by educators), then perhaps these shocking numbers will be. Salary.com listed \$44.926 as an average starting salary for public educators on August 27, 2021. On the other side of the pay scale, high-paying elementary school teachers make \$71,000 a year, while paid high-school teachers make \$71,000 a year on average. Meanwhile, in Luxembourg, the highest average wage for primary school teachers is 114,000 euros (or \$133.316.16) annually. Looking at things on a state base, New York teachers go out on top, making a median salary of \$85.258 (via USA Today) - although New York also requires teachers to earn a master within their first five years of being at work, a warning that can create more barriers for educators on the run. Other states that compare with the New York payscale include California, Massachusetts, Connecticut and Alaska, but many others land at the opposite end of the spectrum, including Oklahoma, where "half of all teachers are [made] less than \$33.630 per year" in 2019. EdTech Magazine asked: "If you were offered a job that paid an average annual salary of \$49,000 and asked you to work 12- at 16 hours, would you take it?" Looks rough, doesn't it?
